1st Temporary suspension of the Peak Tram Service for the upgrade project From 23 April 2019 (Tuesday) for approximately 2-3 months

The Peak Tram has proudly served Hong Kong for 130 years. It has successfully transformed from an essential mode of transport to one of Hong Kong's most popular tourist attractions, serving more than 6 million passengers per year.

The approval of Chief Executive in Council for the operating right and upgrade project was granted in 2018, and a substantial upgrade of the Peak Tram system and stations commenced in January 2019, scheduled for completion in early 2021. The upgrade project involves a significant investment of HK\$684 million, privately funded by Peak Tramways Company, Limited.

The upgrade project will replace the current tramcars, which have a capacity of 120 passengers, with new 210 passenger tramcars. As a result of the larger tramcars, we will completely replace all haulage and control systems, lay new track rails and strengthen the track foundations and bridges. We will also need to extend the current "passing loop" and relocate the Lower Terminus further uphill.

We are also planning to completely refurbish both upper and lower termini and create additional queueing capacity at the Lower Terminus for up to 1300 passengers, in a comfortable and entertaining environment.

For such a comprehensive upgrade, some temporary suspension to the Peak Tram service will be unavoidable and we have limited this to two suspension periods. *The first suspension will start from Tuesday, 23 April 2019 for approximately 2-3 months*.

During the first temporary service suspension period, visitors can take the following alternative public transport services to the Peak:

- (A) A Special Route No. X15 between Admiralty (West) Bus Terminus (near MTR Admiralty Station Exit B) and The Peak will be operated by New World First Bus (NWFB);
- (B) NWFB Route No. 15 (Central (Central Ferry Piers) / Exchange Square The Peak);
- (C) NWFB Route No. 15B (Wan Chai (Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre Extension) The Peak) service on Sundays and Public Holidays only;
- (**D**) Hong Kong Island Green Minibus Route No. 1 (Central (Hong Kong Station Public Transport Interchange) The Peak); or
- (E) Taxi.





Note:

- The Peak Tower and Sky Terrace 428 will remain open during the temporary suspension period.
- Bus and Green Minibus services will be strengthened to meet passenger demand when necessary.
- Services provided by NWFB Route No. 15C (Central Ferry Piers (Pier 8) Garden Road (Lower Peak Tram Station) will be suspended during the period.

Taxis are plentiful throughout Hong Kong and can be hailed on the street (except restricted areas) or summoned by the HK Taxi App or phone. Hong Kong taxis are metered, relatively inexpensive by international standards and air-conditioned.

Hiking trails are available to the Peak (please visit Google / Baidu map for details). The walk from Central to The Peak takes around 1 to 1.5 hours.

The Peak Tram is one of the world's oldest and most famous funicular railways. Opened in May 1888, the double reversible funicular railway, as it is technically known, rises from 28m to 396m above sea level along a 1.4 km track with a gradient of between 4 to 27 degrees. Among Hong Kong's most popular tourist attractions, the Tram terminates at The Peak Tower shopping and entertainment complex, which has one of the world's greatest panoramic views.

The Peak Tower is one of Hong Kong's most recognizable icons and is a leading tourist destination. The Peak Tower also offers four exciting signature restaurants with stunning views, as well as a number of innovative casual dining outlets. A unique festival-market-style shopping arcade and spectacular special-effects lighting, both inside and out, also serve to make The Peak Tower one of Hong Kong's most compelling leisure destinations for residents and tourists alike.

Located at 428 metres above sea level, Sky Terrace 428, the highest viewing terrace in Hong Kong offering stunning 360-degree panoramic views, spectacular panoramic views of the vibrant city – from the stunning cityscape to the tranquility of greenery landscape, across the Victoria Harbour and the South China Sea.
